
I wish everyone a relaxing and enjoyable summer. I look forward to seeing many of you in July at the Convention and let's keep praying for peace in Ireland and worldwide.

Imagine it's fall, 1808 and a newly ordained priest, <u>Fr. William</u> <u>Francis Xavier O'Brien</u>, rides into a small town in Western Pennsylvania at the confluence of the Allegheny and Monongahela River. His mission is to establish the **first Roman Catholic Parish in Pittsburgh**. He finds only 20 Catholic families in the area and none with the financial means to support a new church. So begins the saga of the first Catholic Church west of the Allegheny Mountains. With the missionary zeal of St. Patrick himself and some early support, Fr. O'Brien was able to lay a church cornerstone in 1808 and open a completed, first St. Patrick's Church in 1811: a small brick church with a wooden floor, a pitched roof and no pews, as they couldn't yet be afforded.

From those humble beginnings, the parish grew and outgrew a number of buildings until finally on March 17th, 1936, the church as we know it today was dedicated. <u>History reports that</u> <u>during its construction a piece of the Blarney Stone was</u> <u>inserted in the Round Tower of the church.</u> <u>A key feature</u> <u>of "Old St. Patrick's Church is that it contains 28 Holy</u>



Stairs of marble, situated within the center of the church. These Holy Stairs represent the 28 steps between Christ and Pilate when Pilate condemned Jesus to death. There are only 5 other replicas of these stairs in the world. Ascending the Holy Stairs is a devotion that one does on their knees.

The garden features an <u>outdoor grotto in honor of the apparition of Our Lady of Lourdes</u>. Statues in the garden honor: The Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Bernadette, Saint Ann, Saint Joseph, Saint Patrick, Saint Anthony, and Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha -Lady of the Mohawks. The surprising beauty and oasis of solitude in the bustling city reminds us that God's grace can be found in the most unexpected places.



Over its many years of providing services to Pittsburgh's Catholic Community it has been known for its mission to the poor and needy of Pittsburgh and the surrounding areas. For many years it was home to Pittsburgh's Irish Catholic immigrant community, helping many during the periods of "No Irish Need Apply" and rampant discrimination because they were both Irish and Catholic. They also helped many of the other Catholic immigrant groups establish their early churches as well.

Throughout the lifetime of St. Patrick's Church, it has been the **Ancient Order of Hibernians** that has stepped up when the Church needed a hand to keep it going. Today the AOH has stepped up again to aid in the restoration of this historic Catholic landmark. This time, led by Allegheny County Division 9 over \$50,000 worth of concrete, landscaping and building improvement has been provided for Old St. Patrick's, all at no cost to the church.

Rope Mass in Remeberance of the Molly Maguines

Once again, the Old Jail Museum of Jim Thorpe opened its doors on June 18th, 2022, for us Hibernians to hold a Mass of Remembrance with an altar positioned directly in front of the gallows



for the ten victims of "Day of the Rope" - June 21, 1877. Hosted by Carbon County's AOH Division One ~ Alec Campbell, with LAOH Sisters Kathleen Crampsie, Marcia Evans, and Dianne Mascari serving as the choir ~ Rev. Ronald Minner inspired all in

attendance to "leave our handprint, in any small way, to make your community better."

The Molly Maguires are considered leaders and martyrs in the struggle for coal miners fighting for worker's rights. Four Irish Americans died in the Jim

Thorpe prison, and six in jail in Pottsville. The Coal Mine attorneys prosecuted them, and the Coal Mine's Judge convicted them, with no fairness shown to the men.



Before his hanging, one of the men, Thomas Fisher, placed his hand on the floor of his cell and then placed it firmly on the wall proclaiming, "This

handprint will remain as proof of my innocence." Today, visitors can still see the handprint, even though many wardens have tried to "eradicate it by washing it,

painting it, and even taking down part of the wall and re-plastering it."

Well, times have changed! As we approach this summer of 2022, I decided to give my Sister-Hibernians some spiritual homework. Don't worry, I won't check it in the Fall! And I retired my yardstick long ago!

Your assignment is to continue to pray and to go to Mass. Even if it is inconvenient or not a pleasant experience, God graces us beyond what we can imagine through the Word and Eucharist. Secondly, I have found that another grace-filled task is the work of forgiveness...of ourselves and others. How do I know if I have not forgiven myself? I feel guilty when I recall the situation or event. How do I know if I have not forgiven someone? When I recall the incident, I still feel strong emotions like resentment or anger. Sound familiar?
